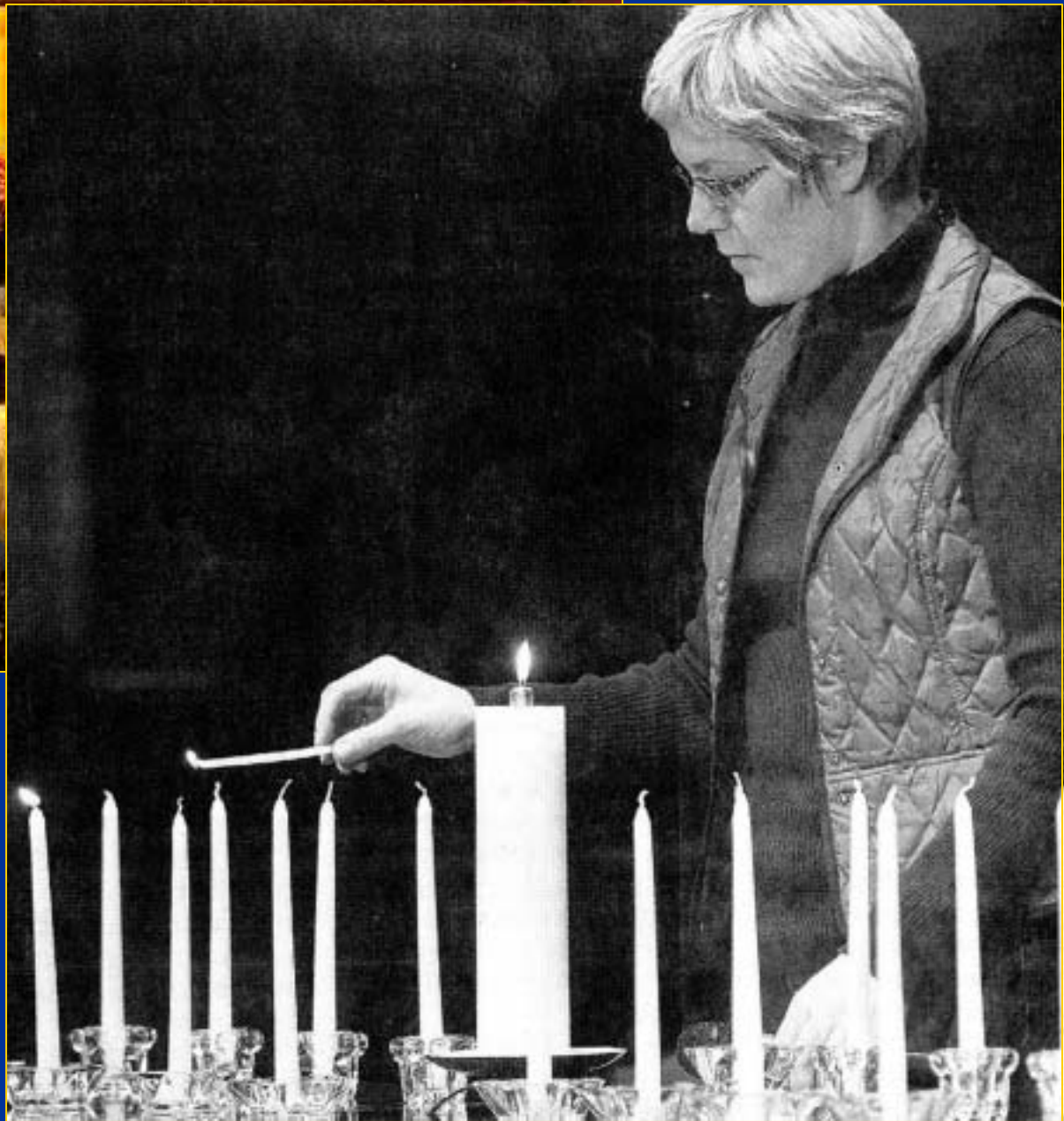

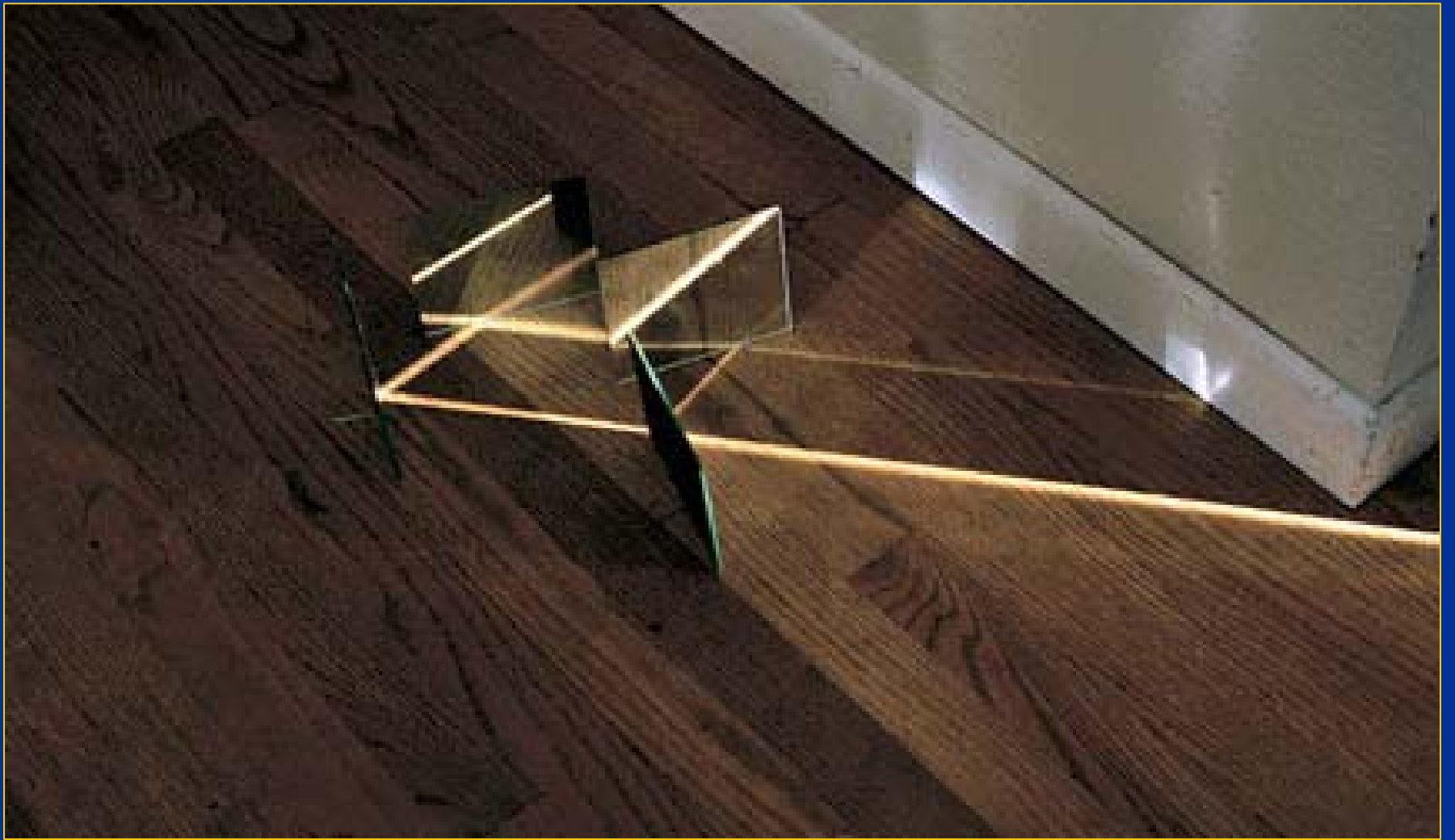




# *Sing a New Song*

# *Time Machine*

## After Ronald Mallett

Mallett was born in Roaring Spring, Pennsylvania, on March 30, 1945 and grew up in The Bronx in New York City, New York. When he was 10 years old, his father died at age 33 of a heart attack. Inspired by a Classics Illustrated comic book version of H.G. Wells' *The Time Machine*, Mallett resolved to travel back in time to save his father. This idea became a lifelong obsession.
