To support them in their journeys, a number of women who have ministered alongside Barb and Bonnie decided to make each of them a quilt that would be a comfort and reminder to them that they are loved and supported and remembered in prayer. Each quilt consisted of a circle of hands made from an assortment of beautiful and colourful fabrics provided from the 'stash' of a few of our quilting parishioners. Over the course of several Tuesday mornings, we gathered at the church to trace out hands, cut the hands out of the fabrics and then adhere them to the quilt back in three layers of intersecting hands. A local quilter who has a long arm machine quilted each of the two projects, using a design called "Breath of God".

Barb's quilt was blessed by Reverend Sandra and presented to her on Sunday, December 22, and Bonnie's was blessed by Reverend Sandra and

given to her last Sunday, January 12. Liz Garland took photos as the quilts were underway and provided Barb and Bonnie each with a small album as a memento of the enthusiasm, creativity and care that went into the making of each quilt.
